

## PRESIDENTS REPORT

With another season completed and planning well underway for season 2024-2025, it gives me great pleasure to report on once again another successful year for Eimeo Surf Life Saving Club. As we reflect on the accomplishments of the past season, we also look towards the future. We are committed to building a strong, inclusive, and dynamic community with a focus on friends, family and fun. We want our members to feel welcome whenever they are around the Club.

Like all Surf Clubs, our primary focus is providing voluntary lifesaving service and ensuring the safety of beachgoers. I am proud that we have kept our beach fatality-free this season. This achievement is a testament to the dedication and commitment of our members who volunteered for beach patrols and water safety. For a small Club the change in the patrol agreement to Sundays and public holidays has had a significant impact on member burn-out and retention. This was probably best demonstrated by the first time in a long time, we did not struggle to fill the easter patrol roster. We are in discussions with SLSQ to have this continue for another season.

I want to acknowledge the efforts and contributions of all our patrolling members in upholding our commitment to saving lives. I extend my appreciation to all our Patrol Captains, IRB Drivers and Crews for taking on extra responsibilities. Our drivers and crews had their skills tested this season at North Aussies and took on extra duties to ensure the smooth running of this carnival when other clubs did not fill their rostered slots. To our Patrol Captain Andrew Malouf and his amazing secretary Alecia Malouf thank you for overseeing our lifesaving services. I am looking forward to next season with three members going through their trainers qualification to increase the capacity of our education team.

When we look back on the season that has been, it has been action packed. Last August we celebrated our 20 + 3 year anniversary for the Club with our gala dinner. Our original celebration was delayed due to COVID. I believe our belated party could not have been better. It was a pleasure to see so many past and present members come and celebrate. We may be the youngest club in the branch but over our short history we have achieved much. It was a pleasure to have Bonnie Hancock as our special guest. I know many people walked away with a new found appreciation for the definition of determination, resilience and goal setting. Colleen Harris and Harriet Mclennan were instrumental to ensuring our event was planned down to the finest details.

With the loss of Food and Wine we had to dig deep and come up with a different way to think about fundraising. David and Sarah Dowden were instrumental in reshaping our focus. Oktoberfest was a tremendous success and saw members of our Club along with the Sunset Bay Outriggers deliver an amazing festival for the community allowing us to raise much needed funds to pay our insurance bill.

The Club has made profit on trading of \$93,742.86 on a cash basis this financial year an improvement on the previous financial year. This has been due to a number of unprecedented grants received by Surf Life Saving Queensland to assist with building maintenance and increased insurance costs. Next season we are going to have to plan on significant increases to these overhead costs and manage this impact on the Club's bottomline.

### **VICE PRESIDENTS REPORT**

The 2023/4 season rounds out nearly 2 decades on the ESLSC and Supporters Management Committees for me. Since signing up in late 2004 as a nipper parent and possible bronze patrolling member, I have had oodles of wonderful opportunities along with my family in forging terrific friendships on the beach locally and across Qld.

The highlights far outshine the lowlights in that period and nothing beats observing the change in confidence of young nippers who participate in surf sports and nipper days. I know my two kids went through the various phases along with their parents in 'enjoying' the beach at its best. They were both frightened by the sea as 6 & 3 year olds when we moved to Eimeo from the bush. Their respective water prowess evolved over the years and Jenna actually beat our Olympian Meg Harris in a surf race in Under 12s (I think Meg had the flu or similar).

I did have the pleasure of age managing Will and his mates (not all boys either) for a few years. This allowed me to contribute to the development of some teenagers who 'medalled' at states on a few occasions. I think there were bronze and gold medals for beach relay at various ages. I even competed at a number of carnivals over the time with the odd podium finish. Possibly the carnival highlight may have been at the 'Fastest Man on Sand' statewide series 2012, where Will won the U12s over 4 rounds (Townsville, Eimeo, Redcliffe, Broadbeach).

A regular annual highlight was observing our grant writing success and seeing what gear and equipment we could get on the list. When coupled with being first in line with some of the SEQ clubs 'handmedowns', Eimeo was reasonably well served. From new ATVs & IRBs to second hand boats, boards and IRBs from places like Manly (NSW) & Burleigh. A short drive to collect them and we were very pleased with the kit.

Eimeo has been blessed with steadily improving facilities which is a testament to our life members and stalwarts like John & Gaye Galea, Duncan & Tanya Sandford, Julie & Arno Arbeithuber, Fred Harris, Alan Zamp combined with supportive local MPs (George Christensen & others). In my time I've seen the Sailing Club shed develop from the Eimeo Beach Club into a handy place for catching up with locals over an ale or lemonade. The building has had two serious extensions with the upstairs 'training room / office' added first and more recently the 'first aid room / junk or storage area' next. There has been many fine tuning opportunities also, from plumbing to electrical and it can remind us of 'Grandpa's Axe' with new bits all round.

The Food & Wine event was our mainstay fundraiser for more than a decade. It also proved to be a wonderful social occasion involving 60 serving workers and a few kids doing softdrinks in the early days. Interestingly we used to do doorknocks, sausage sizzles, Bunnings wheelbarrow assembly and other labour intense fundraisers. Things have changed on this front and sort of stayed the same.

### **VICE PRESIDENTS REPORT**

In the true way of things Eimeo has supported a number of Miss Surf Girls over the 20 years. A couple brought home glory by being awarded Miss fundraiser or personality. They were all Eimeo folks doing their bit for the movement while having fun. They were certainly different times and like everything they have changed to more community acceptable events suited to the 2000's context.

One standout highlight was the Guiness Record Challenge in 2015 for beach flags. Bloody Cowboys went and beat the Broncos the weekend before didn't they and decided to come to Mackay the weekend of the challenge. Needless to say we almost broke the record and had 500 odd doing flags at Eimeo for about 6 hours. We just beat the tide with the winners being crowned including our National and State flags champs.

Over more recent years Eimeo was acclaimed and recognised by the branch as being the most compliant club on a number of occasions. From our governance processes to local admin we were lucky to have Louise keeping the show rolling. Post Covid things continued to change with significant growth in the Supporters operations and history will show that not everything was as good as it could have been in keeping pace with the growth.

I am happy to retire from the respective committees knowing Eimeo has continued to change and or keep up with member expectations. It has always been a club of 3 x F's – Family, Friends, Fitness (or Firsts) and it is a top spot with a bonzer community ensuring beach safety for all who visit. I know I'm looking forward to the next iteration of the ESLSC Constitution and Bylaws to detect if there is any real difference to the Sunday crowd having fun at the beach.

### **DIRECTOR OF FINANCE**

Over the past year we have found anomalies within our bookkeeping system which have needed to be rectified in-order to present the club's true financial position to members. These anomalies have been present for many years, and unfortunately not noticed or rectified. The irregularities are shown in the Balance Sheet and are noted below.

- Crediting out incorrectly entered invoices some of these invoices have been on the
  balance sheet since 2019 and were
  administrative errors. In short, they were
  never money owed to the Club and not
  picked up. The Club has instigated more
  rigorous processes to ensure this error does
  not occur again.
- Clubhouse \$1.3M As the building is owned by Mackay Regional Council, this figure should never have been shown on the balance sheet as an asset of ours.
- Clubhouse Improvements \$15K Write back of club improvements from asset to expense due to the clubhouse being leased, not owned by the club.
- Accumulated Impairment Loss
  (Depreciation) \$142K Depreciation has not been taken up in the past and as a result our Total Equipment totals have been overstated. Depreciation is taken up to expense the cost of major equipment purchases over the period of the expected working life of such items, and as such give a realistic realisable value. Due to conditions of the environment in which we operate, the committee has set the amount at 50% for historical items. This has been written back to Impairment Write-Off expense reflected in the P/L Statement.
- Total Equity \$376K The above adjustments have resulted in the reduction of our book equity from 1.7M for the FY23.

Cash Funds \$242K – A very pleasing increase of over \$66K and due to increases in income and reduced operating costs.

We have seen a significant increase in our insurance for this season and unfortunately will expect to see this trend continue into this financial year.

Now for the good news.

After adjustments were made an Operating Profit of \$78K is noted which is a testament to all the hard work put in by the committee and volunteers.

Our major fundraising activities for the year (after costs taken out have raised):

- Oktoberfest raised over \$20K for the Club and was predominately used to pay our insurance bill for the year
- Motorshow raised \$3.5K
- Raffles and Containers raised \$5K
- Gala Dinner \$9.9K
- Movie night \$2.2K
- **SOS** \$4.5K

We have raised a significant increase in grant income this year from SLSQ and SLSA:

- Preventative Maintenance \$22.5K
- QFES which will be replaced this season with the changes in funding model
- BSEF from SLSA

The Surf Club this year has ensured the Supporters Club is responsible for expenses that relate to their usage of the building and this has reduced some costs previously paid for by the Surf Club.

This season we were fortunate to implement a Sunday-only roster, thanks to the exceptional negotiating skills of our new President. This change resulted in approximately 360 less hours spent between the flags significantly easing the burden on our team. With seven patrol teams sharing the load, the season became more enjoyable and stress-free for everyone involved.

We observed a handful of patrollers logging 80-90 hours each. This is a considerable reduction compared to previous years, where several members exceeded 100 hours. Additionally, beach

closures were down significantly, and the capture of specimen reflected this improvement.

We had the pleasure of welcoming many new Surf Rescue Certificates (SRC) holders to our teams, as well as a few new Bronze Medallion recipients.

Congratulations to Izac, Seb, Levi and Owen, Kian, Erin, Andrew W, Drew, Kylie and Eve for earning their SRC's, and to Tess, Millie, Kate and Sarah for earning their Bronze Medallions.

Many of our patrollers took the opportunity to up-skill throughout the preseason and the season proper, obtaining various certifications. These included Certificates in First Aid, Advanced Resuscitation Therapy, Silver Medallion IRB Driver, Silver Medallion Beach Management and the Marine Stinger Award.

We extend our gratitude to our Patrol Captains: Mick, Bill, Ross, Marti and Cynthia for their leadership and management of their patrol teams. Your dedication and guidance have been invaluable.

This season, we transitioned from being under the Queensland Fire and Emergency Services (QFES) to the Queensland Police Service (QPS) without any notable changes. Although the radios were supposed to be upgraded to Motorola early in the season, this rollout has not yet

happened.

Eimeo recorded zero breaches this season, a testament to our team's vigilance and professionalism. Looking ahead, we are excited to announce that a new Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB) is scheduled to arrive in November 2024, funded by a QFES grant from the 2022 season. Additionally, a new Side-by-side Vehicle (SSV) has been approved through a Surf Life Saving Queensland (SLSQ) grant. We plan to sell one of the older hulls along with its motor.

Negotiations have already begun to maintain the same patrol agreement for the next season, and we are optimistic about achieving a positive outcome.

Thank you to all our patrollers, committee members, juniors, and families for making this an

outstanding season. Your hard work and dedication are deeply appreciated.

### **DIRECTOR OF SURF SPORTS**

Eimeo started the new surf sports season with a strong showing at the Arcadian Carnival held on the beautiful Magnetic Island. Eimeo's team consisted of 15 competitors that tore into the carnival achieving some great results; this was largely in part to the amount off season winter training that was done by the Nippers, and it was noted by other clubs within the branch. Eimeo came a commendable 5th overall in the branch which is a good result. I must commend those children who continued to turn up to the training throughout winter even on those cold days when jumping in the water seemed like the last thing you wanted to be doing. A big thanks to the commitment of the competitors this season and their parents for getting them to training and travelling to carnivals, and the effort put in by our coaches.

Forrest Beach was next in the carnival schedule where we had 13 members travel up to compete. Once again the competitors had some amazing individual results, however we were able field numerous teams and in some age groups dominated the competition. Again, we came in 5th in the overall points.

North Aussies was very successful with 11 competitors starting the carnival off in the Pool Rescue Competition. The results from the competitors at pool rescue was absolutely outstanding with too many medals to mention. Eimeo finished day one pool rescue session in 7th overall, with only 11 athletes. The next day we were joined by another 6 competitors for the beach session and the water athletes faced some really challenging conditions with strong winds and big seas. All the athletes in the water and on the beach had some astonishing results, just getting a medal at North Aussies is a great achievement however, Eimeo was able to come away with 8 golds, 7 silvers and 3 bronzes just showing the calibre of athletes we have in the club presently. Eimeo finished the carnival in 12th position out of the 21 clubs that competed.

North Barrier Branch Championships were held at Sarina SLSC. We had 24 junior and senior competitors attend this season. We had some new competitors try their first carnival and they done exceptionally well. Once again there where some amazing results, between the individual and team events we had combined total of 31 first places, 19 second places and 20 third places. Every competitor put in a massive effort and should rightfully be proud of themselves. This year we were able to field an all age relay which the children seemed to enjoy more than the competing adults. Eimeo finished in 4th position in the overall NBB rankings and should be very proud of their achievements.

We had 10 nippers selected for the NBB State Team for State Youth Championships, which were held at Burleigh (North Kirra) this year. Although our numbers were down on previous years the results form the competitors were absolutely outstanding. We had four competitors pick up medals, Madison Malagueno getting a silver in the U12 female flags as well as a gold medal with Rhys Phegan in the U12 mixed beach relay, Gold medallists in this event two years in a row... Nina Dicker got a silver medal in the U11 female flags and Nate Espartinez got a bronze medal in the U13 2 x 1Km race. All of the competitors that headed down to states performed exceptionally well and done Eimeo proud, helping North Barrier Branch finish 7th overall out of 45 clubs. What a great achievement.

## **JUNIOR ACTIVITIES - NIPPERS**

It was wonderful to see returning families and to welcome so many new families to our nipper's community. We are passionate about surf life saving and take pride in sharing the skills that enhance beach safety for everyone.

This season marked a significant change to our Nippers Program with the introduction of our 2 pool days, our season ending in December and the signin process and proficiencies moving online.

Kicking off the season with 2 pool sessions enabled us to complete our pool proficiencies while providing our nippers the chance to hone fundamental board skills in calm waters. The meetand-greet activities facilitated smoother introductions, fostering camaraderie among all participants before transitioning to the beach. We took into consideration the feedback from the previous season when organising the calendar for this season. 



## Basis for qualified conclusion

Cash received from membership fees, canteen sales, fundraising and donations are a significant source of revenue for the Eimeo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. The Eimeo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc has determined that it is impracticable to establish control over the collection of donations and other fundraising activity revenue prior to entry in its financial records. Accordingly, as the evidence available to us about revenue from these sources was limited, our review procedures for donations and other fundraising activity revenue had to be restricted to the amounts recorded in the financial records. We therefore are unable to express an opinion on whether cash donations and other cash fundraising activity revenue obtained by the Eimeo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc are complete.

The asset register has been updated in prior years, however, we were not provided with an updated valuation of the asset register for 2024 therefore, we are unable to verify the accuracy and valuation of the assets on hand.

## Qualified conclusion

Except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Conclusion paragraph, in our opinion, the financial report presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the *Eimeo Surf Lifesaving Club Inc* as at 30 April 2024 and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year ended on that date and complies with Australian Accounting Standards to the extent described in Note 1.

## Basis of accounting

We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling management committee reporting responsibilities. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.
