President's **Report**

2025 marks a monumental milestone for the Eimeo Surf Life Saving Club, celebrating 25 years of patrolling Eimeo Beach. Reflecting on this quarter-century of service, we are proud of the community we've built—one that is welcoming, inclusive, and dedicated to the safety and well-being of beachgoers.

Over the past 25 years, more than 360 individuals have donned the iconic red and yellow uniforms, contributing over 52,000 hours of patrol service. Some have served for a single season, while others, like long-time member Zamp, have been with us since the beginning. And now this season, Ross Gee, our original Club Captain, joins this legendary group in the 1000 Hour Club – there are only 3 members before him Bill Lansbury, Alan Zamparutti and Julie Arbeithuber.

With another season completed and planning well underway for season 2025-2026, it gives me great pleasure to report on once again another successful year for Eimeo Surf Life Saving Club. As we reflect on the accomplishments of the past season, we also look towards the future. We are committed to building a strong, inclusive, and dynamic community with a focus on friends, family and fun. We want our members to feel welcome whenever they are around the Club.

The Club was successful in obtaining \$400K in Grant Funding from the State Government through Surf Life Saving Queensland to fix the back retaining wall and drainage issues. This project will be completed within the next 12 months. Andrew has been working closely with the appointed Engineers Paragon to design a solution that will meet our needs and give us the best platform to ensure future growth.

Amanda Camm, as part of her election commitments, made it possible for the Club to be able to obtain funding for Master Planning. Funding for master planning is difficult to obtain, and we are grateful for this grant. As a Club we need to come up with a plan for what we require in the future so that we can design and build a Club that meets our members needs. The Club facilities are getting to a point where substantial funding will be required for the future and unless we can articulate our vision and needs we will not be in a place to obtain this funding.

Like all Surf Clubs, our primary focus is providing voluntary lifesaving service and ensuring the safety of beachgoers. I am proud that we have kept our beach fatality-free this season. This achievement is a testament to the dedication and commitment of our members who volunteered for beach patrols and water safety. For a small Club the change in the patrol agreement to Sundays and public holidays has had a significant impact on reducing member burn-out and retention. This has been assisted with our new Bronze and SRC members.





I want to acknowledge the efforts and contributions of all our patrolling members in upholding our commitment to saving lives. I extend my appreciation to all our Patrol Captains, IRB Drivers and Crews for taking on extra responsibilities. This season we have had over 58 awards processed. This is a massive milestone for our small Club and has significantly improved our patrolling capabilities. We are continuing to recruit and retain our nipper parents as patrollers and working on developing the retention of our Cadet members. As a Club this is where we struggle the most.

This year, we begin a new tradition—Career Patrol Hour Milestone Recognition.

These milestones reflect just a portion of what our members give. While many contributions—like coaching, committee work, and event support—aren't always recorded, these patrol hours represent a key part of what keeps our Club running.

The Women in Sports Grant from the State Government was invaluable funding that allowed us to develop our members through a full weekend program and then ongoing coaching support. Bonnie Hancock delivered an engaging and relevant program looking at: nutrition, mental resilience and surf sports training. Our coaches received extra support with ongoing training program development.

Our Junior Activities Program makes up the bulk of our members and is a perfect entry point to being more heavily involved with our Club. Many thanks to our crew of volunteers who make our Nippers program so successful under our JAC Alecia. Our member retention will be a focus on our juniors in the season to come. A Sunday morning would not be possible without our Age Managers, Coaches, Water Safety, and volunteers. We appreciate all assistance we can receive to ensuring we continue to deliver a nippers program that has our kids coming back season after season.

In closing I wish to thank my husband Andrew for his continuing patience and understanding in my role here at the club and also our children Zara, Hugo and Fletcher who enjoy their Surf Club life with an enthusiasm which I hope we will enjoy as a family for many years to come.

Director of Finance **Report**

It has been another busy season with the inclusion of the hospitality and functions now part of the Surf Club's core business. The very wet summer has impacted trading of our hospitality and functions division. However, it should be noted that the inclusion of the hospitality functions within the surf club has reduced our overall dependency on members to assist with fundraising. However, moving forward we will need to review this regularly especially around building maintenance costs that continue to eat into our savings.

Insurance continues to be the Club's largest cost - for the 2024-2025 season we once again saw an increase in the premiums paid:

- Workcover for volunteers \$3,985.96
- Marine Hull \$1,754.20
- Vehicle Insurance \$1,012.95
- Association \$373.10
- Director Insurance \$66.36
- Equipment and Machinery \$16,780.27
- Public Liability \$6,950.96
- Workcover paid staff \$1,366.62

We have had an unexpected bill from the previous auditors Forsyths Accounting Services when they billed us for 2 years worth of audits as they had forgotten to bill us for a previous financial year.

The new IRB that we had paid for over 18 months ago has arrived. We have also purchased a new motor with full surf set up under the BSEF grant funding. The new motor will arrive before the start of the season.

At the start of the season a new SSV was purchased through QPS Lifesaving Services Gear and Equipment Boost Funding from Mackay Kawasaki. The old SSV was sold for \$9,000.

Raffles at the Northern Beaches Bowls Club and fortnightly at the Surf Club Friday nights have raised \$5,010 to go towards surf sports and nippers equipment. Ensuring we undertake these raffles is important to the Clubs financial stability. A more structured approach will be implemented this coming season to ensure we make the most of this revenue stream.

Containers for Change has helped raise \$770 this season. The contribution is down from previous years due to the impact on hospitality trading from the weather.





The Club has made the strategic decision to reduce the sell price on stinger suits to increase usage and public uptake. The Club has been able to secure quality stinger suits at a significantly reduced cost price as part of the transition the Club reduced the cost of old stinger suit stock to well below cost price to enable the movement of these items. By reducing the sell price of stinger suits we have seen a significant uptake in wearing of stinger suits.

As a Club we have invested a significant amount in junior and member development. This has been made possible through the Women in Sport Grant and Active Clubs. Members benefited from training from Bonnie Hancock this season through an indepth Women in Sport workshop and then ongoing training over a number of months.

Last financial year (March 2023) the Club received \$24,750 to undertake maintenance works on the Club. This funding along with the \$20,000 from the closure of the Supports Club the Club spent:

- \$4,459.09 replacing old solar system with electric hot water system, wiring and repair the roof
- \$27,271.72 adding additional door to deck, new wall to hide toilets, painting inside
- \$5,545 rewiring and replacing the lights upstairs and installing new fans

A deposit of \$5,480 has been paid to replace the floor upstairs which will be finalised early June. The Club has transitioned this financial year to Xero to assist in Club financial management. Xero integrates with Square our inventory and POS system. This has made the financial management of the club more transparent and streamlined with automated integration.

2024-2025 has been another busy season for our Club. The Management Committee would like to thank Marg our Club Administrator for ensuring the day to day operations of our Club continues to flow.

Marg is instrumental to ensuring we have our weekly stock ordered for the hospitality division and ensuring the back end processing of all things surf life saving. We were grateful this season to receive \$10,000 from Surf Life Saving to go towards our Administration fees.

Bluecards are a key tool used within our Surf Club to enable member protection. We encourage that all members obtain their volunteer bluecard and action any expiries before they become overdue.

CONSTITUTION UPDATES

The Club has formally adopted our new Constitution during this past season, reflecting the extensive effort that had been made by members of our committee and those prior.

I would like to thank all who provided input into the drafts in particular Bill Lansbury for his experience and knowledge of the Club. I would also like to thank Kerrie Barnes from Surf Life Saving Queensland for their support during the process to enable us to ensure we followed the correct processes.

The new Constitution and By Laws have been lodged with the Office of Fair Trading and ACNC.

The updated Constitution and By Laws are available on the Club website.

The focus for the upcoming season is formalising our operational policies and procedures. SLSQ provide us with a great framework and we aim to work with this to make it applicable to our Club.

Club House Director Report

This is the first year the Surf Club has taken over the running of the hospitality division as the Eimeo Surf Life Saving Supporters Club was officially closed on the 30/06/2024.

The year since the transition has been significantly impacted by weather and the continual need to ensure assets are maintained and replaced. The environment in which we operate significantly impacts the useful life of assets and the building.

Cynthia has been working closely with SLSQ to finalise the Tranche 3 funding allocated and set up for the Back Retaining Wall project. This project is unique where the Club does not control the funds or deliverables, this is managed by SLSQ and we must seek approval for any commitments or spending before any work is undertaken. Paragon Consulting Engineers have been engaged to complete the design component. This is expected to be completed by September 2025 with the execution of the work around March 2026.

The staff who work in our hospitality area go above and beyond, each and every week to meet the needs of our members and the public. Without the commitment of our staff to be resilient and flexible working in our unique environment we would be unable to deliver the services we currently provide.

Water damage continues to cost us significant funds in electrical works and building repairs.

Director of Surf Sports Report

Eimeo started the new surf sports season with an excellent showing at the Arcadian Carnival held on the beautiful Magnetic Island. Eimeo's team consisted of 16 youth competitors and 7 adult competitors that tore into the carnival achieving some fantastic results; The strong results were the culmination of starting early with winter training and individually getting back into the pool. I must commend those children who continued to turn up to the training throughout winter even on those cold days when jumping in the water seemed like the last thing you wanted to be doing. Eimeo came 3rd overall in the branch for the carnival with 25 first places which was only surpassed by the winner of the carnival and an amazing result.

Forrest Beach was next in the carnival schedule where we had 10 members travel up to compete. Another great carnival where the competitors had some amazing individual results, however we were able field numerous teams and in some age groups dominated the competition. We finished in 6th for the overall points for the carnival but once again finished with 22 first places which was only surpassed by two other clubs, again emphasizing how competitive Eimeo is

North Aussies was very successful with 16 competitors completing the squad. The carnival started off with the Pool Rescue Competition on day 1 and results from the competitors at pool rescue were outstanding with many medals won. The next day was the start of competition for the beach session and the water athletes who faced some really challenging competition.

All the athletes in the water and on the beach had some astonishing results, just getting a medal at North Aussies is a great achievement however, Eimeo was able to come away with 8 golds, 5 silvers and 5 bronzes just showing the calibre of athletes we have in the club presently.

A special mention to Madison Malagueno and Rhys Phegan who won selection into the Qld country side to compete in the interbranch competition on the back of their strong results from North Aussies.

North Barrier Branch Championships were held at Sarina SLSC. We had 28 competitors attend this season which was up from last year and great to see, especially for the kids in the younger age groups experiencing their first big carnival. Once again there where some amazing results, between the individual and team events we had combined total of 22 first places, 29 second places and 20 third places. Every competitor put in a massive effort and should rightfully be proud of themselves. Eimeo finished in a tied 4th position in the overall NBB rankings and should be very proud of their achievements.

We had 11 nippers selected for the NBB State Team for State Youth Championships, which were to be held at North Kirra. Unfortunately, due to adverse weather conditions produced from Ex cyclone Alfred it was cancelled. This was a huge disappointment to everyone, especially the competitors who had put in the hard work to make the NBB team and then continuing to train for months in preparation for States.

A big thanks to the commitment of the competitors this season and their parents for getting them to training and travelling to carnivals, and the effort put in by our coaches and parents who stepped up this season to help out with the training sessions throughout the season from helping with water safety to running beach and water arenas.

Thanks to all those who help meet our ratios at carnivals by doing water safety, driving and crewing IRB's, wearing the Officials shirt or being a Team/Age Manager, without everyone stepping up to help we wouldn't be able to compete.

Congratulations to all competitors on a successful Surf Sports season.





NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2025

The financial statements cover Eimeo Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity. Eimeo Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a not-for-profit association incorporated in Queensland under the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 ('the Act').

The functional and presentation currency of Eimeo Surf Life Saving Club Inc is Australian dollars.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of preparation

In the opinion of the committee of management, Eimeo Surf Life Saving Club Inc is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial statements who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows, AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors and AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs.

Material accounting policy information relating to the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements and material accounting policies all comply with the recognition and measurement requirements in the Australian Accounting Standards.

2 Material accounting policy information

Income tax

The association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

Revenue and other income

Revenue from contracts with customers

Revenue is recognised on a basis that reflects the transfer of control of promised goods or services to customers at an amount that reflects the consideration the association expects to receive in exchange for those goods or services.

Generally, the timing of the payment for sale of goods and rendering of services corresponds closely to the timing of satisfaction of the performance obligations, however where there is a difference, it will result in the recognition of a receivable, contract asset or contract liability.

None of the revenue streams of the association have any significant financing terms as there is less than 12 months between receipt of funds and satisfaction of performance obligations.

Interest revenue

Interest is recognised using the effective interest method.

Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Plant and equipment is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life to the association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and is net of any rebates and discounts received. Net realisable value is estimated using the most reliable evidence available at the reporting date and inventory is written down through an obsolescence provision if necessary.

Impairment of non-financial assets

At the end of each reporting period, the association determines whether there is evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where this indicator exists and regardless for goodwill, indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the assets is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss, except for goodwill.
